Everyday Broccoli Cheese Chicken

Ingredients:

- 4ea skinless boneless chicken Breast halves (~1 lb)
- 1 Can Broccoli Cheese Soup
- 2 Cups Broccoli florets
- 1/3 Cup of Milk
- 1 TBS Olive Oil
- 1/8 tps Pepper

Instructions:

- In skillet over medium heat cook chicken in Olive Oil for 10 minutes or until well browned on both sides. Spoon off oil.
- Stir in remaining ingredients. Heat to Boiling
- Reduce heat to Low. Cover and simmer for 10 minutes until chicken is tender and Broccoli is done. Stir occasionally.


