Those words were borrowed by yours truly to brief Post 60's judges before the Colorado River Veterans Invitational JROTC Drill Competition held 6 February at Mohave High School, and they did just that. 9 of us judged such events as Color Guard, 4 person Armed and Unarmed, and 10+ Armed and Unarmed performed by teams from Arizona, Utah, and the Navaho Nation. Seeing those fine young men and ladies was stirring and uplifting and restores faith in the future of our country. And here's the pride part: according to the organizers, there were 19 judges in all, 2 or them being Regular Army recruiters. When you subtract that from the total there were 17 judges from veteran's organizations in the Tri-State Area, and over half of them were from Post 60. Thanks go out to Jim & Victoria Conely, Kelly Hotchkiss, Odean Miller, Chuck Mannara, Don Peterson, and Dave & Kathleen Whitehead. I can speak for them all when I say from a personal point of view it was one of the best experiences I've ever had. Proud? You bet. But wait, there's more! On the same day the Post hosted an 8 hour training class called Boots To Business ably under Fred Doten's oversight. Also this month Mel Puls organized the first ever Post 60 team for the American Cancer Society' Relay For Life, we held the first ever Post 60 Rummage Sale which was a huge success (see separate stories and photos elsewhere in this Newsletter) and at this month's general membership meeting by unanimous vote we will chartering the first ever Post 60 Riders (see photos and story inside this edition). And last but certainly not least, Kelly Hotchkiss and Norm Koan organized our first ever Mexican Dinner night and you can see the details and the menu inside.

A new transfer to Post 60 was at his first meeting, and stood up in the meeting to spontaneously say he'd watched the Legion Report on TV 2 last week and that in all of his long experience as a Legionnaire he'd never been so proud of the American Legion than he was watching that show. It was a moving tribute to the good hard work of all of us. Wow! Maybe we should designate February as Post Pride Month, but then, it happens 12 months a year because of our members. Next up: leading the parade at Town Fest in April.

As I mentioned last month we are nearing our 100% membership renewal goal. We have ten renewals in the last month. My personal goal is 100% contact of all members. If you know of anyone who needs assistance with membership dues let us know. We still have the One-On-One Program, up and running.

News Alert: In case you have not heard, Post 60 dues will be raised to \$35.00 for Legion Year 2017. National has raised their portion of the dues by \$5.00, so the amount Post 60 gets to keep, has decreased by \$5.00. This is a change which has been voted on by our Executive Board. What this means to you, as a member, is you will be paying \$5.00 more and that \$5.00 will stay here in Laughlin to help our Veterans and community.

We are a strong Post right now and growing. Let me give you an example: On February 19th we had a power outage in Laughlin. It affected 5000 out of 7300 residents. The Post was dark at about 1920 hrs until 2330 hrs. This was on a Friday, so the Fish Fry was underway. Everything stopped.

All of you should be proud of your Post 60. We had a great Rummage Sale and spread a lot of love around our neighborhood. POST 60's RECIPE CORNER

Italian Beef Party Sandwiches

- 5lbs London Broil cut to ½ lb. size
- 2tbs canola oil
- 2 cups water
- 1ea medium onion chopped
- 4ea garlic cloves, minced
- 2ea envelopes Italian salad dressing mix
- 1ea envelope zesty Italian salad dressing mix
- 1ea envelope (0.87oz) brown gravy mix
- 2tbs crushed red pepper flakes
- 1tbs Italian seasoning
- 2tsp Worcestershire
- 16ea Hoagie Buns, split
- Sliced provolone cheese, optional; Giardiniera optional.

Instructions:

- In large skillet brown each piece meat in oil on all sides. Drain. Transfer meat to a slow cooker. Combine the water, onion, garlic, salad dressing and gravy mixes, pepper flakes, Italian seasoning and Worcestershire sauce. Pour over beef. Cover and cook on low for 8-10 hrs or until meat is tender.
- Remove beef; cool slightly. Skim fat from cooking juices. Pour juices into a large bowl. Shred beef with two forks; add to bowl. Cool.
- Place in a Crock Pot; heat through. Using a slotted spoon, place ½ cup on each bun. Top with cheese and Giardiniera if desired.
- To freeze, transfer to freezer containers at desired portions sizes. Freeze for up to 3 months

LAUGHLIN'S COMMUNITY GARDEN

American Legion Post 60, in conjunction with the Nevada Cooperative Extension, is constructing a community Garden for the Town of Laughlin. The garden, located at the southern boundary of the Spirit Mountain Community Center, will consist of 21 garden plots. There are two garden sizes being constructed. Fifteen will be 8ft by 4ft and six will be 12ft by 4ft. All garden plots are constructed from concrete blocks, concreted in, to form above-ground plots. The 15 smaller plots will be available to citizens within Laughlin. The six larger plots will be made available to organizations such as the "Boys and Girls Club, the Senor Center and the elementary school. Each plot will have its own water supply

Clark County provided $\frac{1}{4}$ acre of land in support of the garden. The Nevada Cooperative Extension donated the material required to construct the garden plots and the Post 60 Legion Family are providing the labor and design engineering. Also supporting is Ace Hardware, Mohave Valley with concrete forming lumber and CEMEX with some concrete and gravel.
